The first time you do this, you will need to set up user ID, password, and banking information. Please remember to put your account number in the invoice tab. Any bills that have a problem and are returned will be charged the return check fee of \$20

Water schedule will be:

Up to Three days a week – you choose the days
Monday thru Saturday
5am to 10 am and 5pm to 10pm

Do not water both morning and night on the same lawn. Please do not water when it's windy or when it's raining. We are asking you to be prudent in your use and conserve where you can so the water will last throughout the summer. You can shut off your automatic sprinklers when it's raining. Please **NO** water on Sunday. The water situation this year is severe due to the lack of snow this winter. Water, whether culinary or secondary, comes from the same source. Please be wise and conserve your water usage. Remember if we all work together in conserving this resource, we will have the water we need for the upcoming watering season.
